
Ways to help your child at home:

- Ensure all homework is completed.

Learning Challenge:

In this learning challenge we will investigate questions like “What is a habitat? Who lives where and why? Who eats what and why? Why do we need to look after habitats? Which habitats are under threat and what can we do to save them?” Pupils will be developing their investigative skills by exploring local habitats. For example looking in local parks for insects and small animals and carrying out research and investigate where they're living.

International Schools Project – United Nations Sustainable Goal 4: Quality Education for All'

We have been looking at what it means to have quality education and is it happening in all countries.
