Archaeologist Day: 7th March 2024

Children will be spending some time to do archaeologist dig in different areas of the school. This will give them some experience of what it is like to be an archaeologist, predicting what they might find in that environment. This is linked to our Learning Challenge topic. What is needed: Wellies

English

In English, we are reading "The Stone Age Boy by Satosh Kitamura". We will explore this text using drama, Guided Reading and then complete different pieces of writing based around the text. The genres we are focusing on this term are quest stories and non-chronological report. We will continue to focus on grammar and punctuation- using a variety of punctuation marks including full stops, commas, exclamation marks, question marks brackets and colons.

Science

In Science, we will be learning about animals including humans. Pupils will identify that animals including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition and that they cannot make their own food. Also, pupils will identify that human and other animals have skeletons and muscle for support, protection and movement.

Maths

In Maths, we will focus on fractions and time. They will learn to recognise, find and write fractions. This will include unit and non-unit fractions with small denominators and same denominators. Pupils will continue to learn the times table and their inverses. In addition, they will continue to do reasoning and solve problems activities to ensure they develop the skill set to solve problem later in life.

Learning Challenge

In this learning challenge we will find out about archaeologists and in particular find out about how life was in the past. We will investigate questions like, What was life like at these times? What can we learn from objects? What did the people look like in these times? What can we find out about the sites from maps and aerial photographs? How are these sites being looked after?
