We will be writing newspaper reports and non-chronological reports based around our class novel, 'Kasper Prince of Cats', the Titanic, and our topic 'Our Watery World'. Our non-fiction writing will be linked to our learning in science and geography.

In guided reading, we will be focusing developing our reading aloud voice and answering a range of comprehension questions.

Maths

We will be learning about multiplying fractions and mixed numbers by an integer. We will also learn how to calculate fractions of amounts.

We will also link our fractions work to decimal and percentages and looking at how these are equivalent.

This term we will be learning about properties and changes of material. We will compare everyday materials and group them according to their properties. We will investigate dissolving and how some changes can be reversed. Our practical work will include separating materials using evaporation, filtering and sieving. We will learn about reversible and irreversible changes.

<u>Learning Challenge</u>

Our geography topic this term is 'Rivers'.

We will be learning about the: water cycle; how rivers erode, transport and deposit; the features of a river and how rivers are used for industry and for leisure. We will be able to learn about the River Thames and will take a local walk to look at the River Wandle.
